TREASURER'S REPORT: TRICIA MONTGOMERY (absent)/TONI KORYAKUSS REPORTED

The SRE PAC bank account balances as of May 5th, 2022 are as follows: General Account balance is \$14,621.37
Gaming Grant Account balance is \$10,986.72
Grade 5 account balance is \$2,745.34

Other Info: The bank account balances are high because there are still outstanding cheques for expenses to be written including for the Swing Set/Field Enhancement project.

Fundraising: As our school year hasn't been completed yet, we don't have the final numbers for our fundraisers held throughout the school year. They were, Hot Lunch, Popcorn Days, Created by Kids, Fundscript & a Movie Night.

Swing Set/Field Enhancements: Money still to come out of the accounts for the swing set/field enhancement project. The project has been started, the swingset is done, the bench w/plaque, as well as picnic tables are still outstanding. We are waiting on the pricing return bill from SD#23 so we can pay it. The amount approved by the PAC for the playground enhancements is \$19,000/\$9,500 from our Gaming Account & \$9,500 from the General Account.

Mr. Watson will continue to follow-up with SD#23 regarding seeing this project to completion.

COPAC REPORT: AMANDA KRAFT

It was a different looking year this year for COPAC as everything that went on was done by Zoom. We were still able to accomplish some of the goals we set out to do and still were able to offer learning to parents in an online fashion. Some items that were talked about by COPAC this year included:
