VICE PRESIDENT'S REPORT: TONI KORYAKUSS spoke for SUZAN MILES, absent

We worked hard last year with our fundraising efforts and all the hard work has paid off. **Here is an update regarding our current financial situation:**

- The Gaming Commission has opted to not issue a fine to the SRE PAC. This was an important ruling as a fine could have been significant.
- · The SRE PAC is now free to utilize their account to support student activities and will be looking for opportunities to make a difference for students. We can vote to use PAC funds for field trips etc, if we want to do that.
 - Based on a significant fundraising effort last year, the PAC has some funds to spend.
- The SRE PAC is receiving monthly restitution payments, and will be receiving these until the misappropriated dollars are fully returned.
- The SRE PAC has made another submission to the gaming commission to receive a grant for the 2019-2020 year. This request is still pending and should be ruled on in the near future.
- · The funds in our Gaming account can only be used for field trips, per the Gaming commission guidelines. The guidelines are on the government gaming website for reading if interested. https://www2.gov.bc.ca/gov/content/sports-culture/gambling-fundraising/gaming-grants/documents-forms #five
- · In our no fine agreement, a percentage of the funds recovered will be going back into the Gaming account.
 - · We are still eligible to apply for and receive Raffle licenses.

Grade 5 Discussion:

The Grade 5's are having a tough year financially, they had no balance to start the year as there were misappropriated funds from the Grade 5 account totaling \$1,900. In the past, any overflow would go towards the next years Grade 5 class. Discussed with Mark W. & Susan M., SRE is a family, we want fundraising to be shared, but neither is more important than the other. All parents are working together for fundraising goals. We are proposing to put \$2,000 in the Grade 5 account towards their Fundraising Goals this year.

We would also like to have a swingset put on the primary side of the playground geared toward smaller children. There is a grant to fund playground equipment "Let Them Be Kids", it requires children to be involved in the planning process. As a PAC we will vote on our fundraising goals as to where the money should be spent.

COMMITTEE REPORTS:

HOT LUNCH - Toni Koryakuss:

Have been receiving complaints of cold food, it's due to orders arriving early and no way to keep it warm. Rutland Dominios is donating 12 food warming bags to us to help keep food warm in the classrooms. We have switched to only two vendors, Dominos and Boston Pizza to simplify the hot lunch process.

Hot lunch ordering always closes on the 25th of the month for the following month. Ordering can be done to the end of the school year now. All the information is on the Hot Lunch website.

GRADE 5 FUNDRAISING - Heather Johnson:

Jamie O'C. made the motion to transfer \$2,000 from PAC account into Grade 5 account to support their fundraising goals. Jenn W. seconded. Motion carried by majority vote.

Movie Night: Diane J. - Grade 5's would like to host another movie night, they purchased enough supplies for two movie nights. January is too busy, they would like to host one in March.

Bottle Drive Fundraiser: Reminder the Bottle Drive is still happening, drop off returnables at depot, just need phone number of school to input and get labels to put on bags. Matthew G. is the parent heading this up if there are any questions.

Gardom Lake: Needs \$500 deposit for our event there on June 11th, 2020. An invoice needs to be received in order to write the cheque. Heather J. made the motion to send the \$500 cheque for Gardom Lake deposit as soon as the invoice is received. Petra T. seconded. Motion carried by majority vote.

Fundraiser Idea: Chances has Funday Friday's, it's \$10 a ticket usually, if we charge \$20 a ticket, we'd make \$10 profit per ticket. It would be promoted to family and friends and the public. **Jennifer Williams will follow up.**

The SRE PAC bank account balances as of January 16th, 2020 are as follows:

General account balance is \$13,592.88 minus \$150.67 to Grade 5 acct, for a balance of \$13,422.21

Grade 5 account balance is \$748.08 plus \$150.67 from General acct, for a balance of \$898.75

Gaming Grant account balance is \$2,554.95
